## CONNECTING WOMEN IN MATHEMATICS ACROSS CANADA II

The second workshop on Connecting Women in Mathematics Across Canada will be held at the BIRS from July 21-23, 2004. The first workshop took place June 12-13, 2003, at the University of Alberta in Edmonton, prior to the CMS Summer 2003 meeting and was very successful.

Participants will be chosen on the basis of an application, which will include a one page statement of interest and two reference letters, one of which should be from the participant's supervisor. All participants will be expected to give a short presentation on their research interests. A maximum of 50 participants is expected.

The conference program will include two mathematics talks by women mathematicians, short presentations given by participants, and two to four panel discussions on topics such as career strategies, surviving a graduate school, and balancing a career with ones personal and family life. All panel discussions will be followed by small group discussions of these topics.

The participants, presenters, and organizers will be lodged in the Banff Research Station.

The conference is a project of the CMS Committee for Women in Mathematics, in cooperation with the Students Committee. The organizing committee includes: Malgorzata Dubiel (SFU), chair, Judith McDonald, Washington State University, Rachel Kuske (UBC), Dorette Pronk (Dalhousie), Susan Cooper (Queen's).
